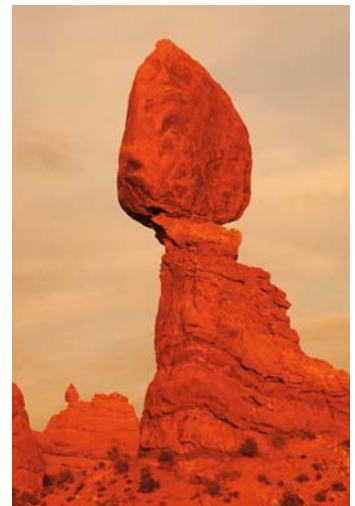

How do you find the King Oscar Motel in the Algona-Pacific area?

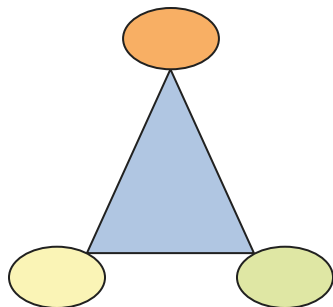
From Seattle: Take I-5 South to Hwy 18. Take Hwy 18 East to Hwy 167. Take the 167 South Algona/Pacific exit.

Turn left and the motel will be located on the right-hand side of the road.

From Portland: Take I-5 North to 512 East to Hwy 167. Take the Algona/Pacific exit, make a right-hand turn

and the motel will be located on the right side of the road.

Presenters at LAP Summer Conference

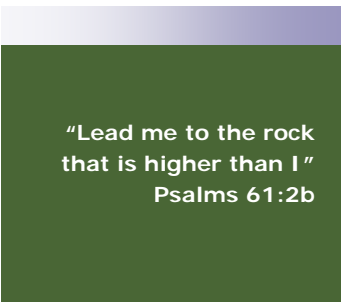
